Friends of Richfield Heritage Preserve

Planning to attend the RHP Goat Derby and Craft Show on May 4? Come out a little early and enjoy one of two migratory bird hikes the Friends are offering that Saturday morning.

Expert birder Fred Dinkelbach will lead the hikes -- from 7:30-9:00 a.m. and from 9:30-10:30 a.m. He will review some basic birding skills and then lead attendees on an easy 1-1/2-mile hike through different habitats in the park, listening and looking for our feathered friends. Attendees will meet at the Summer Barn -- 4225 Oviatt Road park entrance. Don't forget the binoculars!

The following week -- on Saturday, May 11 -- the Friends are hosting a guided wildflower hike from 1:00-3:30 p.m. with plant ecologist Jennifer Windus. This moderate woodland walk will feature her insights on the park's native spring wildflowers and their role in the natural world. Attendees will gather by the kiosk near Kirby's Mill at the 3771 Oviatt Road park entrance.
